-The first candidate(曹漢光) has been the district councilor for 20 years.

-This is the first year that two candidates participate in the election \rightarrow one more choice -The first interviewee found on Shing Fai Terrace was not satisfied with the performance of the first candidate, so he would vote for the second candidate.

-The second interviewee found in the playground was strongly unsatisfied with the first candidate as the assistance of the first candidate worked in black box, but he would not vote on the Election Day.

-The third interviewee found outside the residential building did not concern on the job of district councilor and the Election Day. He would not vote on the Election Day, he has registered, though.

Conclusions drawn from your observation

-The first candidate was not welcomed and residents there were not satisfied with his performance.

-The atmosphere of district election is not strong.

- Why don't the residents show their unsatisfactory through the election or other ways, but put up with the not ideal district councilor for twenty years?
