  - Candidate 2 (independent & democratic) 40

  - Candidate 2 (independent & democratic) 8

- Banners
  - Colour tone:
    - Candidate 1 (DBA) orange and brown
    - Candidate 2 (independent & democratic) green
  - Quality:
    - Candidate 1 (DBA) plastic sheet
    - Candidate 2 (independent & democratic) plastic sheet
  - Contents:
    - Candidate 1 (DBA) candidate name; candidate photo; candidate number; name of constituency; party name; slogan (willing to take responsibility; serving the community)
    - Candidate 2 (independent & democratic) candidate name; candidate photo; candidate number; name of constituency; no party name (but no mention on independent candidate); candidate's job (social worker); people who support her (eminent democratic figures); slogan (democratic new generation; build the future with professional quality)
- Poster
  - Colour tone:
    - Candidate 1 (DBA) orange and brown
    - Candidate 2 (independent & democratic) green
  - Quality:
    - Candidate 1 (DBA) paper
    - Candidate 2 (independent & democratic) paper
  - Contents:
    - Candidate 1 (DBA) exactly as those in banner
    - Candidate 2 (independent & democratic) same as banner plus more personal information (age; academic qualification; professional qualification; working experience)

Conclusions drawn from your observation

- Difference in leaflet colour tone:
  - DBA is using orange as usual
  - Candidate 2's poster and banner give people an impression that she belongs to the Democratic Party because of 1) no mention of her independent status; 2) use green colour; 3) listing out the name of the leaders of Democratic Party; and 4) use of the word "democracy"
- Difference in leaflet content
  - Candidate 1's poster and banner are plain => Candidate 1 is quite confident in this election (he's the existing District Councilor in this district)
  - Candidate 2 listed out all of her selling point in the poster and banner; using eminent democratic figures to mobilize voters' support => Candidate 2 wants people to know her good side and uses democracy as a tool to generate support (she's new to this district and her name was not even heard of prior to the beginning of the election)

New questions generated from your observations or findings

• In terms of quantity and quality of the posters and banners, candidate from DBA (1) is doing much better than the independent candidate (2). Can this factor help the DBA candidate in winning the election?
