Topics for Group Project

- (1) Plan and conduct a study on Hong Kong people's reaction to Hong Kong stage the 2008 Olympic Equestrian Events.
- (2) Plan and conduct a study on Hong Kong people's reaction to Donald Tsang's being elected the Chief Executive of the HKSAR.
- (3) Plan and conduct a study on Hong Kong people's reaction to Ma Ying-jeou's being elected Chairman of Kuomintang in Taiwan.

Format of Assignments

- Both English and Chinese can be used.
- Flexibility in length and format is allowed, in fact, encouraged, for all assignments.
- The first group assignment shall be in the form of a project proposal of about 5 pages in length. One of the sections of the group project proposal should spell out clearly which group member is responsible for which task(s).
- The first individual assignment shall be a 2-page document which spells out clearly how an individual group member is going to handle his/her work, with reasons.
- The final group project shall be in the form of a project report of about 30 pages in length, excluding bibliography and appendix, if any.
- Individual scores and grades will be awarded to individual assignments, while scores and grades for group projects will be shared among group members. An individual's final grade for the whole programme will be a combination of group and individual scores in the following ratio: first group assignment – 20%, first individual assignment – 20%, final group project – 60%.
- Critical thinking and knowledge of practical skills will be the key elements which the lecturer and supporting instructors look for in marking the assignments.
